DR. ANDREAS TIETZE

Member of Parliament Schleswig-Holstein, Germany

Dr. Andreas Tietze was born on February, 9th 1962 in Gelsenkirchen. After his Abitur (German university entrance qualification) Andreas Tietze studied social pedagogy and theology in Bochum, Heidelberg, Jerusalem and Kiel.

After more than fifteen years working as an education advisor and head of children's and youth facilities on the island of Sylt, he decided, true to the motto „Lifelong learning“, to return to university. He subsequently studied Socioeconomics at the Leuphana University of Lüneburg. He completed his degree in 2006 with an MBA (Master of Business Administration) „Management of Social Economics“.

Aiming to continuously deepen his expertise, he developed his master's thesis into a doctorate degree (Dr. phil.), which he completed in February 2010. He initially remained loyal to his work at university as a lecturer at Leuphana University of Lüneburg and as managing director at the German Institute for Social Sciences. Today, he is a lecturer at the *Protestant University for Social Work and Diacony – Das Rauhe Haus* in Hamburg.

As an economic and social expert, he has been particularly concerned with the challenges in the social and health economy in Germany. Due to his scientific activities, he is a nationally recognized expert for network systems in the care and health industry. As an author he regularly publishes specialized literature on relevant research areas.

Furthermore, he is active in his church as a member of the Synod North Frisia which named him member of the II. State Synod of the Northern Church. Between 2012 and 2018 he was elected President of the I. State Synod of the Northern Church.

Andreas Tietze has been politically active within the Green Party in Schleswig-Holstein since the early 1990s. From 1999 to 2001 he has been a member of the state executive committee of the Greens as well as a member of the negotiating commission of the red-green coalition (between the social democrats and Green Party), which ruled Schleswig-Holstein from 2000 to 2005.

He was continuously active in North Frisia between 2003 and 2010 as a member of the district parliament and leader of the parliamentary group of the Green Party.

After the elections and the formation of the first coalition between the Green Party, the Free Democratic Party, and the Christian Democratic Union at state level in Schleswig-Holstein, he held the office of Deputy District Administrator until his election to the State Parliament in Schleswig-Holstein.

In the 2009 state election he was elected to state parliament via the Green Party's state list and was additionally named deputy head of the parliamentary group. In May 2012, he was again elected to state parliament via the Green Party's state list.

In May 2017, he again took up the position on the state list for the Green Party and won the constituents' confidence to be reinstated into his current position. Since his first election to the State Parliament Schleswig-Holstein in 2009, he has been a member of the Economic Committee, of which he has been the chairman since 2017. Additionally, he is the spokesman for his parliamentary group for the subjects Mobility, Housing, and Tourism. Lastly, he is a member of the Committee on Petitions.

Furthermore, in 2012 Andreas Tietze was a candidate of the Green Party for the election of the Lord Mayor of Kiel.

Andreas Tietze lives in Husum, is married and has two adult children.
